### **Ruling on “Choose Life” license plate does not mean the end of the debate**

Greensboro, NC: “Judge Fox’s ruling that the “Choose Life” license plate is unconstitutional because the opposing viewpoint did not get its plate does not mean the end of the debate,” stated Barbara Holt, President of North Carolina Right to Life. “Other states in the 4<sup>th</sup> circuit have experienced similar setbacks but ultimately got the plate; we are hopeful that the same thing will happen in NC.”

Rep. Mitch Gillespie has stated that he intends to continue to work to see that NC gets a Choose Life license plate and join the 29 other states that have them.

According to the web site of the national Choose Life group that advocates for and tracks the plates, “The Choose Life license plates have raised over \$16.3 million in those states for the causes of life and adoption. Over 764,000 plates have been sold/renewed in that time.”

In North Carolina, the Pregnancy Care Fellowship, overseeing the sale of the plate, has reported that they have received well over the 300 required prepaid requests from NC citizens to get the plate. The revenue generated from the sale of the Choose Life license plate will help the NC centers in their important work of providing free of charge assistance to mothers needing help during and after their pregnancies.
